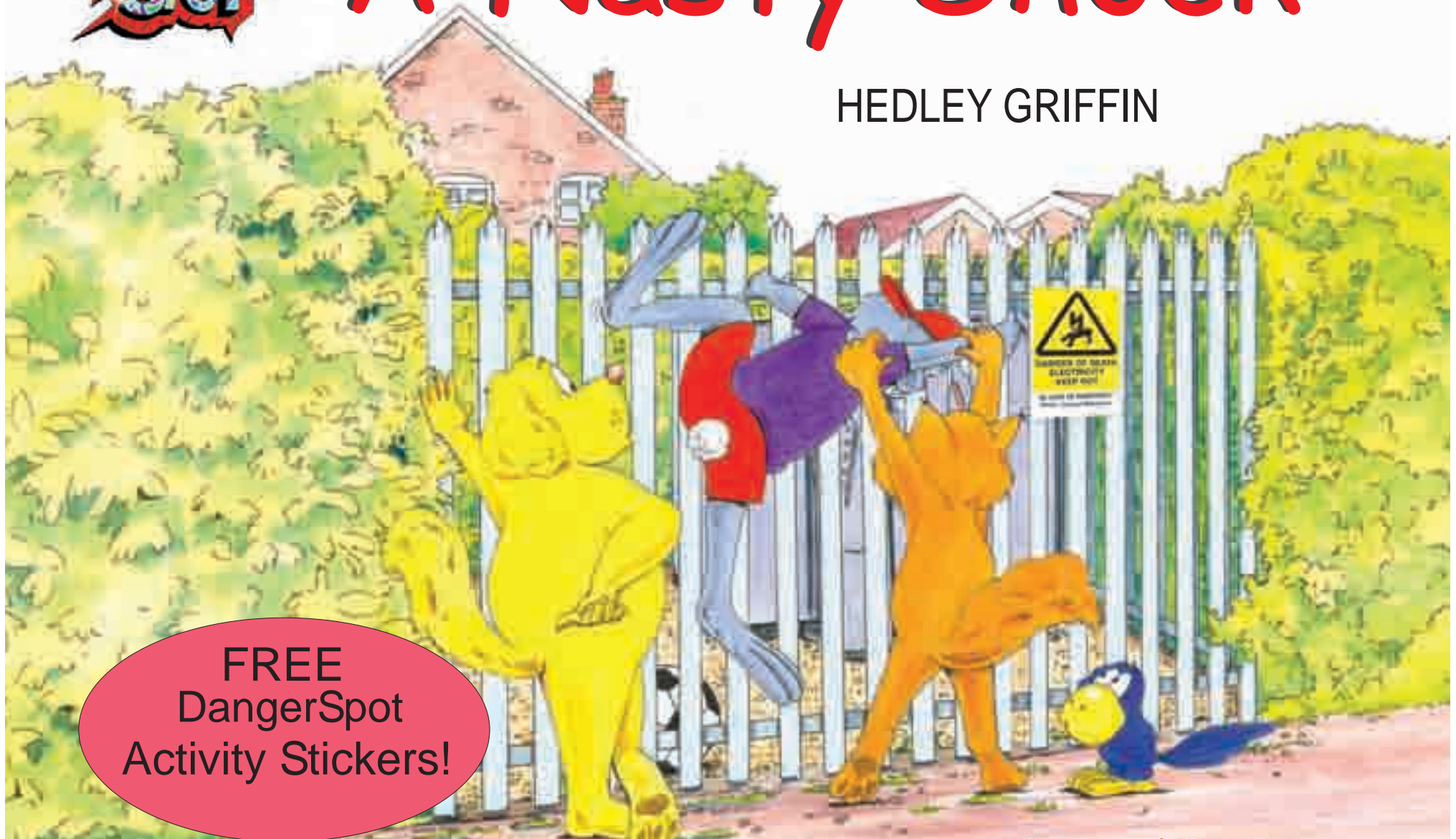

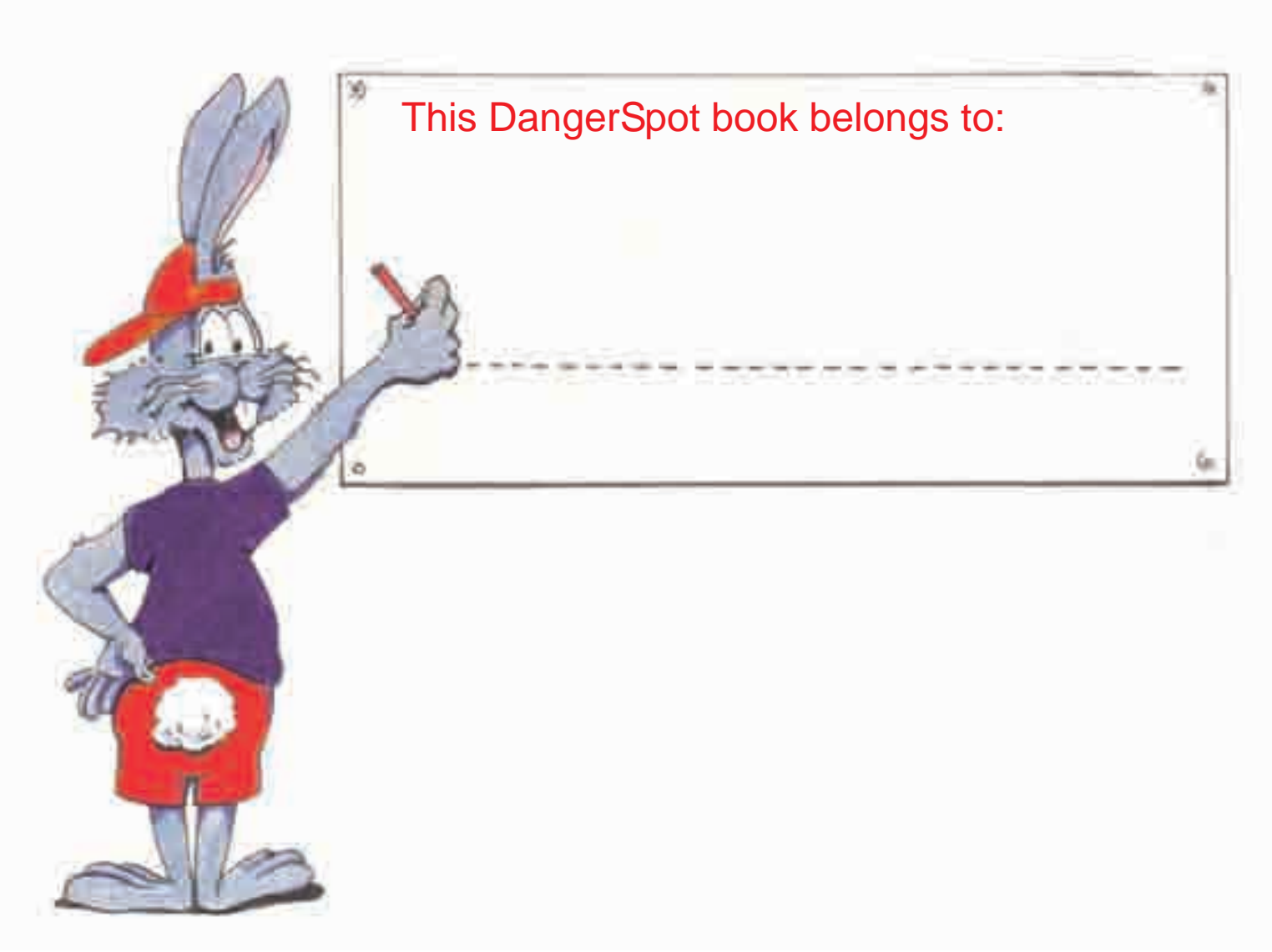

Early one morning, before breakfast, Harey, the hare-brained rabbit and his friends were playing a football game on the computer, when suddenly, the screen went off.



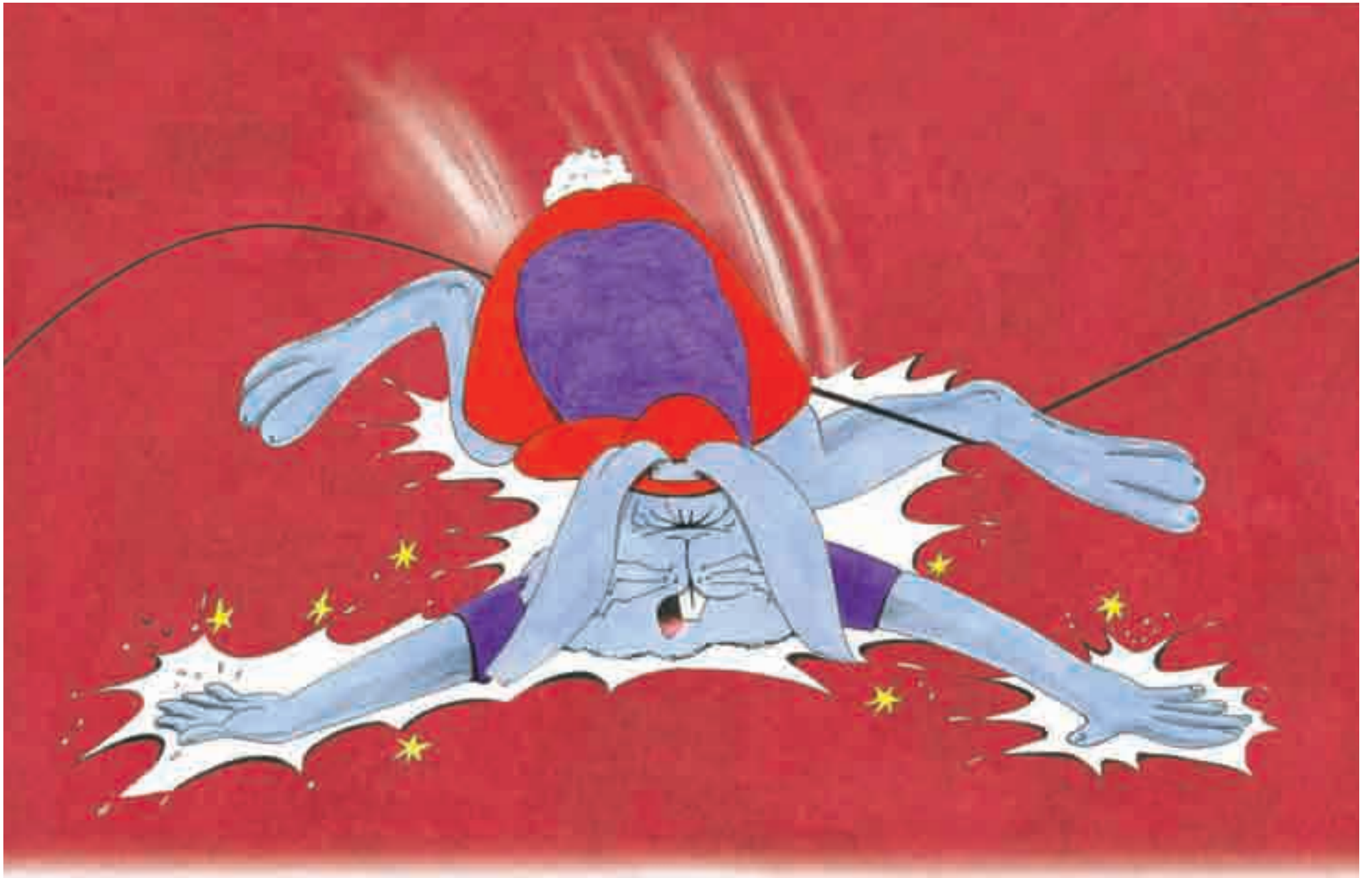
‘Oh fiddlesticks! What now? Just as I was going to score a goal,’

who also knew nothing about it.



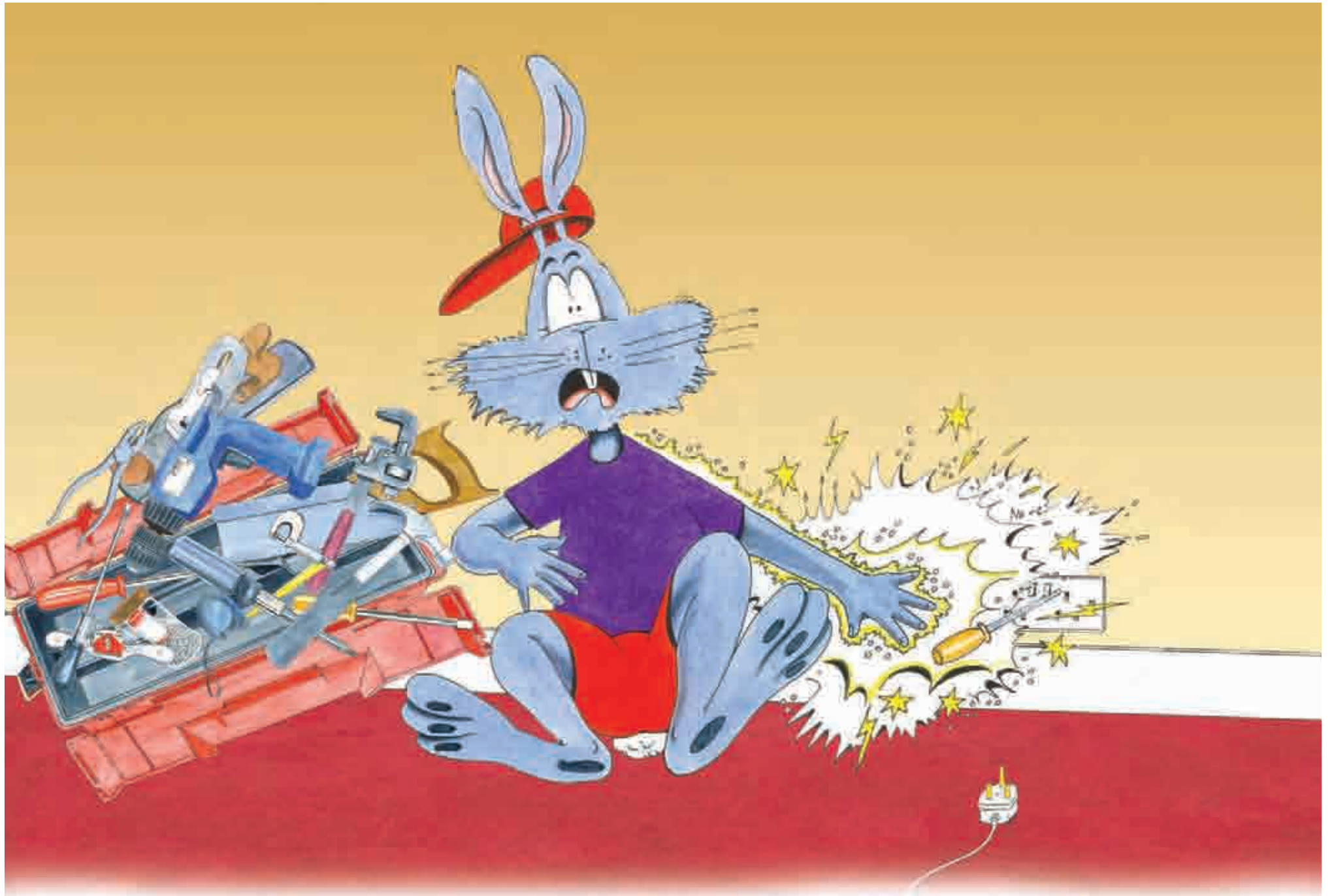
'I know how to fix that. I am good at fixing electrical things. I can fix anything,' Harey boasted. 'I'll get some tools.'
