

Children's picture books, with safety stickers, helping to prevent accidents within the home and elsewhere.




DangerSpot Books

Falls are the most common accidents amongst children, whilst bumping into people, things or being hurt by falling objects are the second most widespread injuries. Burns and scalds are the third most common, mostly from hot drinks and hot water from a kettle. Poisonings from medicines, garden and household chemicals are the fourth most frequent accidents within the home.


The DangerSpot stories tell of Harey, the hare-brained rabbit, who is always rushing around causing and having accidents. While Chips, the dog, is often the victim of Harey's carelessness Scampi, the cat, tries her best to help with advice and Pillow, the parrot, always repeats the message.

The books include an information sheet and DangerSpot stickers, (except "Stranger Dangers"),

to invite parents and children to place them around the home to identify any danger spots. In this way the books portray accidents and dangers to children in an amusing and, therefore, acceptable fashion whilst teaching the more serious aspects of these issues. The main point about the stickers is that it is very difficult to teach young children about all the dangers around the home. By appreciating that a DangerSpot sticker means "danger, don't touch!" a child has then only to learn one thing - not to go near, or be careful.




A Touch Too Much

The Harey Chat Room






A Harey Day at the Seaside






The Harey Bike Ride



A Nasty Shock



The Deadly Sweet Cupboard



The Dangerous Road Game



He then runs after it without looking and is knocked down by a car, but just survives with bad bruising because the car was not travelling fast.




The Dangerously Big Bunny

A Dangerous Christmas



A Dangerous Day on the Farm





Harey, the hare-brained rabbit, and his friends visit a farm.


Several accidents and misadventures later

and has to be rescued by the Fire Brigade.





Harey the rabbit decides to deep-fry some chips for a barbecue. He fills the fryer too much and abandons it while he goes off to play, with near fatal consequences.



Harey and his friends, go out flying their kite dangerously close to an electricity pylon.




Stranger Dangers



The Hot Cross Bunny





There is nothing there. He then looks under the sink in the cupboard and finds a bottle of bleach, which he drinks and burns his throat as well.




What a Waste!






The Harey Football Match
